The Laying on of Hands and Kneeling for Ordination on Palm Sunday

How Can We Help?


The recent flooding of the Ohio River crested a bit higher than in 2018 when we last removed the pews and pianos anticipating water in the church sanctuary. No water got into our church building, but many homes nearby were damaged. How can we help?

The Mission Committee met on April 13. Our first decision was to send \$1,000 to **Presbyterian Disaster Assistance**, to help in wide-ranging areas of need. But how about in New Richmond? That's when Ruth Saylor and Jackie Nelson went to work,

with Shannon Martin (the Elder serving on Missions). At one point it looked like no one needed help, but they kept digging. They found situations where larger agencies and churches had swept in and brought immediate relief. We were looking for those still needing help after the first wave of flood relief accomplished what it could.

With persistence we found four cases of individuals with specific needs, mostly help with food and additional cash to help recovery. Armed with the Mission Budget of Cranston, an additional gift from a church member, and funds from Knox Presbyterian Church, your Mission Committee provided gift cards and cash gifts to specific people in need. This is how Mission works!

Jack and Barb Pettigrew joined Cranston in 2006; Barb passed away nearly a year ago. Ken Wright had the design ideas to make the entrance to our church look great; Jack had the skill to make the beautiful shelf from black walnut (he also crafted moulding trim and helped finish the doors).

Jack described building the shelf and then the extra care involved in hanging it from the wall which is not quite plumb! The decorative supports under the shelf were a challenge Jack enjoyed. He and Ken worked to get the multiple pieces laminated together looking just right. Jack also created the little church model seen on the shelf.
